1. Apply your Heart to Wisdom - Number your Days - Beware of Covetousness

How much time in life do we spend acquiring things?

How much time do we spend seeking approval from others?

You have heard the saying that, "you can't take it with you"

Are we just sitting on the front porch of life watching time pass?

Are we doing the same things over and over and getting the same good results for us and our families and friends?

The way we live our lives have an impact on others besides ourselves

[Luk 12:13-21 KJV]

- Consider love of riches can pervert the mind
- We can not serve God and mammon (money)
- Consider your things, your abundance, your possessions, your striving

[Luk 16:13-14 KJV] 13 No servant can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon. 14 And the Pharisees also, who were covetous, heard all these things: and they derided him.

15 And he said unto them, **Take heed, and beware of covetousness**: for a **man's life consisteth not in the abundance of the things which he possesseth**. 16 And he spake a parable unto them, saying, The ground of a certain rich man brought forth plentifully: 17 And he thought within himself, saying, What shall I do, because I have no room where to bestow my fruits? 18 And he said, This will I do: I will pull

down my barns, and build greater; and there will I bestow all my fruits and my goods. 19 And I will say to my soul, Soul, thou hast much goods laid up for many years; take thine ease, eat, drink, [and] be merry. 20 But God said unto him, [Thou] fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee: then whose shall those things be, which thou hast provided? 21 So [is] he that layeth up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God.

2. Apply your Heart to Wisdom - Number your Days – Discovery and use our talents

Luke 19:12-27	Talents are given to make increase no sit on them; some rejected the messenger and message
Revelation 11:18	The nations are angry because Jesus is coming to judge and give rewards
Revelation 18:6	The great false church is rewarded for sins and deception of others
Revelation 22:12	The Church is rewarded for its work for the Kingdom of God

- The Lord Jesus Christ will return to earth reward all according to their work
- Jesus will judge the wicked servant to wasted time and did not try to use their talents/gifts
- We are being evaluated now – make straight crooked paths – repent of sins and do the Lord’s will
- Consider how you’re using your time, your resources, your life – do you have any regrets –would you do anything differently if you had the chance to start over?

3. Apply your Heart to Wisdom - Number your Days – Ask for wisdom for the day – your days

[Jas 1:5-8 KJV] 5 If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all [men] liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. 6 But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. 7 For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord. 8 A double minded man [is] unstable in all his ways.

[Psa 119:133 KJV] 133 Order my steps in thy word: and let not any iniquity have dominion over me.

[Jas 4:13-17 KJV] 13 Go to now, ye that say, To day or to morrow we will go into such a city, and continue there a year, and buy and sell, and get gain: 14 Whereas ye know not what [shall be] on the morrow. For what [is] your life? It is even a vapour, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away. 15 For that ye [ought] to say, If the Lord will, we shall live, and do this, or that. 16 But now ye rejoice in your boastings: all such rejoicing is evil. 17 Therefore to him that knoweth to do good, and doeth [it] not, to him it is sin.

[Luk 16:16 KJV] 16 The law and the prophets [were] until John: since that time the kingdom of God is preached, and every man presseth into it.

The rich man who wasted time and resources could not go back to make it right

4. Apply your Heart to Wisdom - Number your Days – redeem the time because the days are evil

You must fight to manage the time given to you or it will be wasted

[Eph 5:16 KJV] 16 **Redeeming** the time, because the days are evil.

[Col 4:5 KJV] 5 Walk in wisdom toward them that are without, **redeeming** the time.

Strong’s number – Greek word for Redeeming - **Reference #2**

[Psa 37:23, 31 KJV] 23 The steps of a [good] man are ordered by the LORD: and he delighteth in his way. ... 31 The law of his God [is] in his heart; none of his steps shall slide.

[Pro 16:9 KJV] 9 A man's heart deviseth his way: but the LORD directeth his steps.

[Jer 10:23 KJV] 23 O LORD, I know that the way of man [is] not in himself: [it is] not in man that walketh to direct his steps.

[Ecc 3:17 KJV] 17 I said in mine heart, God shall judge the righteous and the wicked: for [there is] a time there for every purpose and for every work.

[Ecc 8:5-6 KJV] 5 Whoso keepeth the commandment shall feel no evil thing: and a wise man's heart discerneth both time and judgment. 6 Because to every purpose there is time and judgment, therefore the misery of man [is] great upon him.
